



WHAT TO KNOW BEFORE SELLING SANTA BARBARA

We have compiled a list of the top questions and objections we get so you are fully prepared to answer them when your clients ask!

1. Best time of year to come:

Santa Barbara's mild Mediterranean climate makes for great weather year-round. The average daily temperatures range from a high of 65 °F in the winter to 75 °F in the summer. My personal favorite time of year is September/October.

2. Objection: "Santa Barbara is too far out of the way/too hard to get to for my trip":

Santa Barbara is easily accessible by plane, train or automobile. If Santa Barbara isn't the main destination, our central location along the CA Coast also makes us a great stopover on a road trip. Santa Barbara Airport (SBA) flies to multiple U.S. destinations, check **their website** to see the closest airport to you. To the South, Los Angeles is an easy 2-hour drive and to the North, we are a beautiful 5-6 hour drive from San Francisco. Amtrak offers two routes: the Pacific Surfliner route, which provides daily service from San Luis Obispo to San Diego, and the Coast Starlight route, which runs from Seattle to Los Angeles, passing through the San Francisco Bay Area, Santa Barbara and Sacramento.

3. Why would I spend more than one night?

Santa Barbara is a small town with big city amenities. There is so much to do - one could spend a week in the wine country alone. In addition to natural beauty of our waterfront, beaches, and mountains with the accompanying outdoor activities, we also have our own symphony, ballet and opera, a vibrant downtown, over 450 restaurants, 220+ wineries and countless cultural/historical sights.
